#### **Important Information on Summer Car Safety**


The Department of Early Education and Care, and the Children's Trust are working together to help keep children and families safe this summer, with the following tips:



- ♦ Never leave children alone in a parked vehicle, under any circumstances, even if the windows are open.
- ◆ Make a habit of looking in the vehicle -front and back -before locking the door and walking away.
- Ensure adequate supervision when children are playing near parked vehicles.
- ♦ Do things to remind yourself that a child is in the vehicle, such as placing your purse, brief-case or something else you need in the back seat so that you will have to check the back seat when you leave the vehicle.
- ♦ If you see a child alone in a hot vehicle, call 911. If they are in distress due to heat, get them out as quickly as possible.

4 cups water

1 cup sugar

1 quart fresh strawberries



1 cup freshlysqueezed lemon juice (about 5-6 lemons)

2 cups cold plain seltzer water or club soda

#### **Preparation:**

- 1. Combine water, sugar, strawberries and lemon juice in a blender. Puree until smooth.
- 2. Pour strawberry lemonade into glasses, filling glasses two-thirds of the way. Pour seltzer water on top of strawberry lemonade.
